Tobacco Cessation Counselling Programme Reinforced

The problem of tobacco use in either the smoked or chewed form has reached epidemic proportions in India, which has the largest number of oral cancer cases in the world, in addition to many other tobacco-related diseases.

For the last 4 years, the Dental Department has been running a Tobacco Cessation Counselling Programme for all tobacco users attending the Dental 1 OPD. When patients decide to quit, they sign a commitment which is attested by their spouse or any other family member.



The main challenge faced by patients is to get through the first week after stopping the habit. For this reason, Dental Department has partnered with the Department of Lifestyle Medicine, to start a 5-day programme of daily counselling to help patients who are committed to quitting the habit.

Patients attending the programme have found the intensive counselling effective because of the personal interaction with counsellors that helps develop an informed and healthy lifestyle. Sessions include talks on nutrition, exercise and life motivation.

The Chaplaincy Department has also volunteered to help with the telephonic follow-up for review and continued encouragement of persons quitting the habit, especially Bengali speakers, who form the majority of participants.
